

Expected Learning Outcomes

French Stage 2: Novice Accelerated, or Novice I part 2 plus Novice II
Courses 325, or 321 and 331

By the end of Stage 2, students will have expanded their ability to perform all the tasks developed in Stage 1. They will also have developed the ability to use sentences, and strings of sentences and recombinations of words, phrases, and expressions, with frequency of errors proportionate to the complexity of the following tasks.
