IV. CORRESPONDENCE

A. Annual Budget Data Request – Concord Finance Committee. Ms. Rigby stated the Budget Data Request was received from the Town of Concord and it is being reviewed and prepared for the Finance Committee Meeting.

V. RECOGNITIONS

A. K-8 Transportation – Wayne Busa, John Arena, Norma Atkinson & bus drivers. Ms. Rigby recognized the Transportation Department and all the bus drivers. Special recognition to Wayne Busa, John Arena and Norma Atkinson for their excellent customer service.

VI. REPORTS & ISSUES FOR DISCUSSION

A. Atlas Curriculum Mapping. Kathy Codianne. Ms. Codianne, Director of Teaching and Learning gave an overview of the Atlas Curriculum Mapping Software Program.

B. School Lunch Program. Chef Alden Cadwell. Chef Cadwell, Director Food Services, stated that there are some short term and long terms goals for food services this year. Goals include reducing processed meat and increasing local in season produce and meat products by 50%.

C. FY13 Budget Development. Mr. Flaherty stated he is working on the early stages of developing the FY13 CPS Budget.

VII. ACTION ITEMS

A. Vote to approve Ripley Little Theater Demolition & Flooring.

A motion was made by Mr. Fischelis seconded by Ms. Spada that the Concord School Committee votes to award the contract for the demolition and flooring portion of the Ripley Little Theatre Project to Classis Construction & Development Corporation of 129 Commonwealth Avenue, Concord, MA in the amount of \$38,799. The motion was unanimously approved.

B. Vote to accept dictionaries from Concord Elks.

A motion was made by Mr. Fischelis seconded by Ms. Spada that the Concord School Committee votes to accept the dictionaries distributed by the Concord Elks to the third grade students. The motion was unanimously approved.

IX. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. Enrollment & Opening Day. Ms. Rigby stated that there is increased enrollment in the K-12 district. The total enrollment in the district is 3171 with 1957 K-8 students and 1214 CCHS students. Ms. Rigby stated that opening day went well and the school year is off to a good start thanks to students, parents and staff.

B. Common Core State Standards. Ms. Rigby stated that curriculum frameworks are used in each content area to guide in developing the standards for what we want students to know and do for each grade level. For the past two years the state has been working to incorporate principles for math programs, which include equity and literacy across the content areas, and standards for mathematical practice which include making sense of problems and persevering in solving them; reasoning abstractly and quantitatively; and, constructing viable arguments and critiquing the reasoning of others. The hallmark of the ELA & Literacy framework is that it specifies the literacy skills and understandings required for college and career readiness in multiple disciplines.
